- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. institution or foreign equivalent. Teachers must have a master's degree to complete the Teacher Leadership Endorsement Program.
- Professional Educator License (PEL) for the state of Illinois.
- Employed in a teaching position

To apply, please submit:

- An application for admission
- Official Transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions you have attended (Elmhurst alumni do not need to request their Elmhurst transcripts)
- A Copy of your Professional Educator License (PEL) for the state of Illinois
- A current resume including:
 - PEL with expiration and renewal dates, and endorsements
 - Undergraduate degree and graduate courses completed
 - A record of your current and past teaching positions
- To apply to the M.Ed. in Teacher Leadership, Teacher Leadership Endorsement or the M.S.Ed in Special Education, please also submit:
 - Letters of Recommendation
 - A 1,000-word Statement of Purpose describing your professional goals and how your graduate program will help you achieve those goals
