Subject: **International Education Grants**

This year the Faculty Development Committee in cooperation with the Center for Professional Excellence office of International Education will award two grants in the amount of approximately \$2500 to cover the costs of attending one of several international faculty development programs.

One grant will support a full-time faculty member attending the Bradley University Berlin-Prague Seminar during June 2001. This seminar is intended for social scientists, historians, art historians, and others interested in recent developments in Central Europe. The Faculty Development Committee welcomes either of two types of applications for the second grant. The first would be for attendance at a seminar sponsored by the Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE). The list of seminars for the summer of 2001 is included. You can also get further information at www.ciee.org/ifds. The second possibility would be an international development opportunity identified by you. If you are applying for this second type of grant, please supply detailed information about the organization with which you will be working.

Please submit your letter of application, not to exceed two pages, by November 28. The application should include an indication of how your participation will enhance your teaching and/or scholarship. Your typed application letter must first be submitted to the Chairperson of your department. The Chairperson must prepare a brief letter of endorsement and forward your request and the endorsement letter to the Faculty Development Committee. We strongly encourage the submission of these materials in electronic form (e-mail or diskette) to Earl Swallow, Chairperson of the Faculty Development Committee (earls@elmhurst.edu or SC012). Electronically submitted applications will be acknowledged by email to you and to the department Chairperson.
