

Call for Faculty Intercultural Curriculum Development
Summer Grant Proposals
The Dean of Faculty and the Center for Scholarship and Teaching
Guidelines & Application

The Dean of Faculty and The Center for Scholarship and Teaching are co-sponsoring faculty development grants for Intercultural Curriculum Development to members of the faculty who have completed an Intercultural Workshop offered by Intercultural Faculty Development *or* who have participated in Intercultural Experiences external to the College offerings. Faculty members who completed a Values Development Tagging workshop are also eligible.

A limited number of grants will be awarded to high-quality proposals intended to create intercultural, international, and diversity courses, to integrate more fully diversity and global concepts into existing courses, or to help aid the development of interculturally related programs. Grants can be awarded to individuals, faculty working on interdisciplinary programs and courses, and to a group of faculty who meet the criteria.

Grantees are expected to:

- 1) Develop a sound, feasible course development plan;
- 2) Develop a course proposal or course proposal changes to be reviewed by Academic Council, and/or other required committees;
- 3) Attend an annual luncheon where grantees share their proposed curricular innovations.

Special attention will be given to proposals that develop *potential* general education (through new course offerings or by substantial revision of general education courses offered currently to meet new value development tagging requirements.) Consideration will be given to proposals that address classroom climate, include local off-campus excursions, or that link multicultural and global issues into a department's curriculum.

Applications (see below) for Intercultural Curriculum Development Summer Grant are **due February 21, 2011**. The Director of the Center for Scholarship and Teaching and the Faculty Development Committee will review applications and make recommendations to the Dean. Award grant funding is through the Dean of Faculty's office. Applications will be judged on quality of the proposed curricular innovation.
