Admission Requirements

- Graduate Application
- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. Institution or foreign equivalent
- Official transcripts from all prior institutions
- Current Resume
- One to three years work experience in a business-related field preferred
- Statement of Purpose
- Letters of Recommendation
- Interview with the program director

Graduate Certificate in Supply Chain Management

If you are new to the field or not sure about pursuing a master's degree, consider a graduate certificate in Supply Chain Management. This program consists of the first four core courses of the Master of Science in Supply Chain Management program. Students who complete the certificate program, can choose to complete their M.S. in Supply Chain Management by completing an additional six courses by applying to the master's program.
