Galapagos Islands (IES Direct Enrollment)

It's your turn to discover one of the world's most beautiful and biologically diverse island locations. It's here that you will get hands-on experience studying topics such as Biology, Ecology, Environmental Studies, Marine Ecology, and Sociology.

- Direct enrollment program organized through the Galápagos Academic Institute for the Arts and Sciences (GAIAS)
- Location: Ecuador
- Living arrangements: Homestays
- 15 credit hours per semester

Australia: Rainforest, Reef, and Cultural Ecology (SIT)

This program explores the terrestrial and marine ecosystems of far North Queensland and the relationship of traditional and contemporary human cultures with the environment.

- Location: Cairns, Australia
- Living Arrangements: homestays, hostels, camping, etc.
- Excursions to: The Great Barrier Reef, The Bush, and the rainforest.
- Includes independent study project

Madagascar: Biodiversity and Natural Resource Management (SIT)

Explore environmental challenges, conservation, and development strategies in Madagascar, an island nation isolated from neighboring landmasses for more than one hundred million years.

This program offers classroom and field-based instruction on topics including the rainforest, dry spiny thicket, alpine and transitional forest, savannah, gallery and littoral forest, mangrove, and coral reef — and within multiple economic, socio-political, and cultural contexts.

- Location: Fort Dauphin, Madagascar
- Living Arrangements: homestay, village stay, etc.
