CONCENTRATIONS

ART: A concentration in art consists of five courses: a minimum of one lecture course and two courses at the 300/400 level, with no more than two courses from outside Elmhurst College.

BIOLOGY: A concentration in biology consists of five courses: one 100-level course can be applied (BIO 100 for students with no previous college biology). Two 300/400 level biology courses are required. BIO 200 and BIO 201 may be substituted for this requirement. A five course sequence will be planned based upon interest in areas such as Botany, Zoology, Microbiology, Molecular Biology or Ecology.

CENTER FOR BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS:

Business Administration -- BUS 230, BUS 250, BUS 263, two additional 300/400 level courses selected in consultation with the Director of Center for Business and Economics.

Management -- BUS 250, BUS 263, BUS 354, BUS 453 and one of the following: BUS 350, BUS 355, BUS 454

CHEMISTRY: CHM 101 or CHM 211, CHM 212, CHM 311, CHM 312, two CHM 200/300/400-level full course electives

COMMUNICATION: COM 114, COM 316, plus three from: COM 213, COM 312, COM 315, COM 317, COM 319, COM 320

COMPUTER SCIENCE/INFORMATION SYSTEMS:

Data Base Programming -- CS 220, CS 255, IS 224, IS 423

Hardware Programming -- CS 220, CS 310, CS 360, CS 440

Management Information Systems -- BUS 230, BUS 263, IS 425, MTH 345

Software Engineering -- CS 220, CS 255, CS 318, CS 320, CS 420, CS 475

System Analysis and Design -- BUS 263, IS 424, IS 425, MTH 162,

Technical/Scientific Programming -- CS 220, CS 255, CS 315, CS 460, MTH 151, MTH 152

Web Development -- CS 220, CS 315, CS 419, CS 440

CRIMINAL JUSTICE: CJ 200, CJ 210, CJ215, CJ 319, CJ 408, CJ 409 OR CJ 410

ENGLISH: **Literature** -- Concentration includes five courses in English above the 100-level, at least four of which must be in literature. All but one of the literature courses must be completed at the 300/400 level. At least three of the courses need to be completed at Elmhurst College.

Writing -- Concentration includes five courses in English above the 100-level, at least four of which must be writing courses at the Intermediate or Advanced level. Must include English 201 or equivalent. At least three of the courses need to be completed at Elmhurst College.

HEALTH: KIN 200, KIN 240 and KIN 250 [all .50 courses], KIN 306, KIN 346 AND KIN 360

HISTORY: Four courses in consultation with History Department chair. Two of the four must be at 300/400 level.

PHILOSOPHY: Required PHL 106, PHL 210, PHL 303 and PHL 304; Recommended PHL 306 or PHL 405

POLITICAL SCIENCE: POL 201 and any four courses at the 300/400 level, including one each from American Politics, World Politics and Political Thought.

PSYCHOLOGY:

Developmental Psychology -- PSY 210; PSY 311 or 422; PSY 313; Two from PSY 317, PSY 318 or PSY 319; PSY 268/368 Field experience is highly recommended.

Human Services -- PSY 210; PSY 312; PSY 317 or PSY 318 or PSY 319; PSY 327; PSY 328; PSY 268/368 Field experience is highly recommended.

Industrial Psychology -- PSY 210; PSY 355 or MTH 345; PSY 303; PSY 326; PSY 422; PSY 268/368 Field experience is highly recommended.

Psychology for Research and Preparation for Graduate Study -- PSY 210; PSY 355 or MTH 345; PSY 356; PSY 411 or PSY 423 or PSY 430; PSY 422; PSY 349/449 Research Mentorship and PSY 492-493 are highly recommended.

SOCIOLOGY: SOC 211, any four of the following: SOC 212, SOC 216/316, SOC 217/317, SOC 301, SOC 304, SOC 305, SOC 310, SOC 319, SOC 408. **Note:** SOC 211 is a prerequisite to all the courses listed above, **except** SOC 212, SOC 216, and SOC 217. Students are strongly encouraged to take courses at the 300 level where there is an option.

URBAN STUDIES: Five course credits; choose three from URB 201/401, URB 210, URB 291, URB 420, URB 430; choose two from EDU 331; GEO 411; ICS 270 and 271; POL 202, POL 300, POL 360
