Receipt of this form in no way indicates acceptance in the Education Program. Students may not enroll in any education courses (SEC) without first being admitted to the Education Program. **Application to the Education Program requires a minimum overall GPA of 2.75 from all institutions of higher learning and a passing score on the Test of Academic Proficiency [formerly Basic Skills] or its equivalent. See the *Application for Admission to a Teacher Education Program* [in your admission packet] or contact the Education Department for admission criteria and procedures.**

Political Science majors must maintain a **major GPA of 2.75 or higher**. All courses taken to meet licensure requirements must be completed for a grade of C (2.0) or higher. All educator preparation programs are subject to revisions required by changes from the Illinois State Board of Education.

ALL students must complete at least half of their Education courses, excluding SEC 200, 300, 450 and student teaching (SEC 455), at Elmhurst College and **must complete three full terms** [Fall/Spring] at Elmhurst College prior to student teaching. Political Science majors are strongly encouraged to have at least 12 semester hours in History so that student teaching placements and endorsements can be facilitated. Full-time teaching positions in only Political Science are uncommon.
