Course Description: Experience the former Austrian Empire through a unique cultural perspective that will engage all of your senses. This course offers students a first-hand account of the vast musical heritage born of the Austrian Empire. From Berlin, the group will travel to Leipzig, Halle, Dresden, Prague, and Vienna. The course will cover musical history from the Baroque, Classical, and Romantic Periods, and will culminate in the 20th Century with World War 2. Students will visit the residences of several prominent composers and the palaces of their royal patrons. Students will attend several concerts in various locations and visit world heritage sites such as the Dresden Elbe Valley, the Vysehrad Ruins in Prague, and Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna. Students will meet renowned artists and local historians and enjoy a dinner cruise on the Danube River with live music.
