**English** majors must have a **minimum major GPA of 2.75 or higher and maintain an overall GPA of 2.75 or higher**. All courses taken to meet licensure requirements must be completed for a grade of C-(1.70) or higher. All educator preparation programs are subject to revisions required by the Illinois State Board of Education.

**ALL students must complete at least half of their Education courses**, excluding SEC 100, 300, 450 and student teaching (SEC 455), at Elmhurst University and **must complete three full terms** [Fall/Spring] at Elmhurst University prior to student teaching.
