Deadline: May 1, 2022

Course credit option: \$3,995 USD

Non-credit option: \$3,995 USD

Cost includes tuition, housing, meals, admission fees, and local transportation to and from co-curricular activities while on campus.

Additional costs include roundtrip airfare and transportation costs to and from the airport; and supplemental health insurance coverage (if student's current health insurance does not cover medical expenses incurred in the United States).

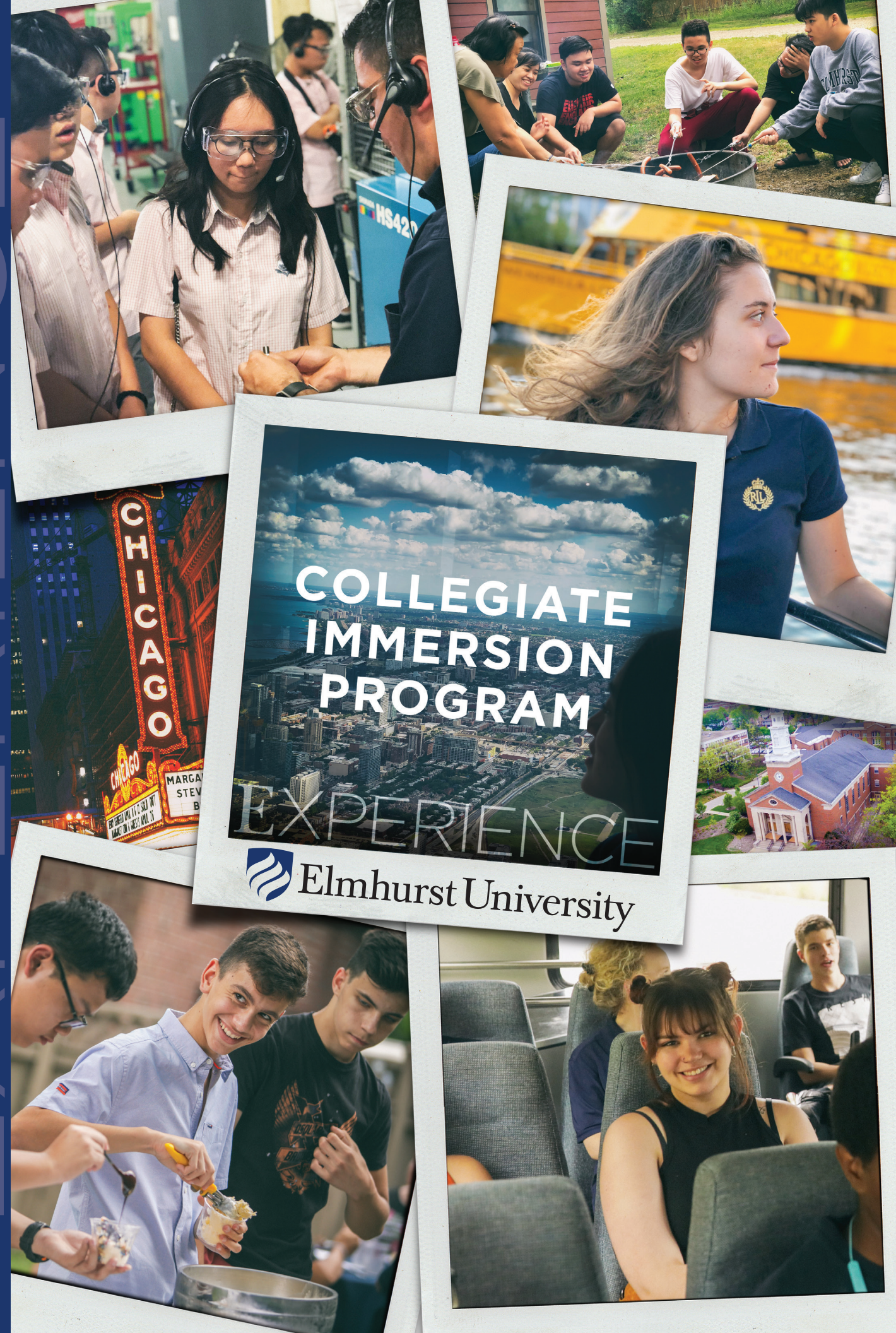
1. Apply today at elmhurst.edu/immersion
