# Fulfilling Elmhurst University Psychology Major Requirements at COD Prescribed Major Electives:

After completing General Psychology (PSYCH 1100) and a statistics course (see below), take up to 3 more psychology courses, selecting from different perspectives. Students should take a maximum of 5 psychology courses at COD. Some notes:

- Some COD Psychology classes not listed here may count as psych electives at EU. Contact EU with specific questions.
- A research course will be required for the Psych Major at EU. If a student takes PSYCH 2285 (Intro to Behavioral Research) at COD, it will transfer in as PSY 356 (Research Methods) at COD. In this case, a student should only take 2 perspectives courses at COD.
