- Three letters of recommendation from educators/administrators who can attest to your leadership qualities, communication skills, and capacity to succeed in graduate study
- A 1,000-word statement of purpose describing your personal and professional goals and how graduate study will help you achieve those goals
- Official transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions you have attended (Elmhurst alumni do not need to request their Elmhurst transcripts.)
- A copy of your Illinois professional educator license
- · A current résumé
