Furniture in Your Unit

Elm Park and Prospect Apartments

- Each resident is provided with an extra-long twin mattress/ bed, dresser, and bookcase
- Kitchen comes with stove, refrigerator, table, and four chairs
- No living room furniture is provided
- Laundry rooms located in lower lever

University Houses

- Each resident is provided an extra-long twin mattress and bed, dresser, desk, bookcase, and desk chair
- Dining area has a table and four chairs. Kitchen comes with stove and refrigerator. No living room furniture is provided
- Houses do not have washers and dryers. Each house receives one access card to do their laundry in West Hall or Cureton Hall.

Preparing for Move-In

- Review this newsletter with those who will be helping you during Move In.
- Consider sharing items with your roommate(s) and contacting them before arriving to discuss a plan.
- Pack items in reusable containers such as plastic bins, bedding bags, or suitcases. Label items with student name and room number.
- Avoid bringing additional large furniture until you have seen and planned out your space.
- Large cargo vans and U-Hauls are strongly discouraged.
- Ask questions if you have them! Your Housing and Residence Life staff is available to assist you.

How Do I Move-In?

- Go to Cureton Hall to check-in and receive keys.
- If you are arriving before Wednesday, August 21 (via the Early Arrival application and process) or after Sunday, August 25, your keys will be available for pick up at Public Safety located in Lehmann Hall (entrance faces Langhorst Field).
- For ease of traffic, enter campus as indicated on the Move In map on the last page and on our website.
- Find your way to the temporary unloading place.
- Once items are removed from the vehicle, <u>move the vehicle</u> to a permanent parking spot. <u>One guest</u> <u>must stay with the car at all times as the vehicle is unloaded</u>.
- Have your JayPass and assigned hall and room number handy. Your JayPass or other photo ID is required to check in.
- Remaining guests and student will move items from curb to the room.
- Boxes should be broken down and removed to vehicles or to recycling dumpsters.
- Check In for Transfer Student Orientation will begin at 12:00 PM on August 24 in the Frick Center.

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Items to Bring to Campus

- Carpeting or rugs
- Coffee pot (maximum 4-cup capacity)
- Computer, laptop, tablet
- Extra-long twin-size sheets for your bed
- Fan
- Gaming systems
- Hot pot/electric tea kettle (no exposed element)
- Items from home to add your personal touch
- Lamp (no halogen bulbs)
- Outlet strip
- Kitchen appliances, microwave
- TV
- Trashcan
- Umbrella
- Toaster ovens and toasters (apartments and houses only)

Items to Leave at Home

- Air conditioner units (window or portable/stand alone)
- Amplified instruments and drums
- Items with exposed heating elements
- Candles and incense, even if unlit
- Ceiling fans
- Electric blankets/heating pads
- Furniture exceeding 300 lbs
- Grills (indoor or outdoor)
- Halogen lamps
- Hazardous materials or weapons
- Homemade lofts
- Hot plates
- Large tabletop games (arcade games, pool table, ping pong, air hockey, etc.)
- Pets, except fish
- Waterbeds

Internet Service

Elm Park and Prospect Apartments are connected to campus internet. Each apartment unit has a University-provided wireless router.

Students residing in University Houses will select their own internet provider. It is the responsibility of students assigned to the unit to pay for any internet service selected. Students residing in houses are not charged the residential tech fee.

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
