Students should have no more than two IC courses remaining for admission to the School of Education.

Admission to Elmhurst University is not admission to a teacher education program. There is a separate application process. Students with a previously earned associate's degree will receive credit for all Elmhurst University AoKs through the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI).
