- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. institution or foreign equivalent
- Current Resume
- Letters of Recommendation
- Undergraduate classes in general psychology, statistics, research methods, and intro to I/O Psychology (or equivalent)
- Intro to I/O Psychology offered at Elmhurst each summer to fulfill the prerequisite
- If prerequisites are needed, you must apply by June 1

Graduates of Elmhurst's M.A. in Industrial/Organizational Psychology program are eligible to apply to the MBA Option or the MDS Option. Both are one-year programs leading to either an MBA with a specialization in the management of people or an M.S. in Data Science.
