Get Professional Experience

Transfer students entering junior year will be able to articulate their professional competencies and personal values; and understand how they relate to their work experiences and professional future.

Online

- Create or update your profile and search for major- related internships and jobs on Handshake.
- Create/update your profile on LinkedIn and start building out your professional network.
- Begin to research graduate school opportunities.

On Campus

- Attend Meet the Professionals and other events to meet with career professionals, learn about career paths and practice networking skills.
- Assume leadership roles in student organizations and clubs.
- Apply for Fall Interview Day for internships and full-time employment.

In Person

- Take the CPP 399 Professional Career Preparation course to learn how to conduct a successful job search and enter the world of work.
- Sign up for the Mentoring Program and gain advice, direction and encouragement from a professional.
- Conduct informational interviews with faculty, family, friends, alumni and company contacts to network for internship opportunities.
- Attend the Elmhurst University Career Fairs and CareerFest to apply for internships.
- Attend information sessions and fairs with professional/graduate school programs.

Take Action

- Complete an internship or field experience.
- Meet with WCCPE Pre-Professional Advisors at the beginning of the fall term (or first term at EU) to prepare for and take graduate/ professional school exams and discuss recommended/required coursework and experiences.
- Create an application strategy and apply to programs that open a year in advance (health professions).
- Establish connections with faculty by the end of junior year for references or letters of recommendation for graduate/professional school as well as internships/jobs.

Senior-year students will solidify their professional goals and competencies, engage in experiences within their chosen field and manage the transitions to their professional career.

- Update your on-line profiles on Handshake and LinkedIn.
- Sharpen your interviewing skills through using StandOut virtual interviewing platform and by participating in the Mock Interview event.

On Campus

- Meet with a WCCPE Career Advisor and use the Al-powered WCCPE Resume Builder to refine your resume and develop a job search strategy.
- Meet with a WCCPE Pre-Professional Advisor to finalize application timelines for your professional program.

In Person

- Sign up for the **Mentoring** program and gain advice, direction and encouragement from a professional.
- Take the CPP 399 Professional Career Preparation course to learn how to conduct a successful job search and enter the world of work.
- Attend the Elmhurst University Career Fairs and CareerFest to apply for full-time positions and participate in the Meet the Professionals events.

Take Action

- Network with family, faculty, WCCPE staff, alumni and company contacts and conduct informational interviews to build out your connections.
- Apply to graduate/professional programs with guidance on the timing from advisors, including securing letters of recommendation and writing personal statements.
